PRESIDENT'S REPORT



On behalf of the Triathlon ACT Board I'd like to present our report card for the 2020/21 session.

Triathlon ACT has seen a lot of change over the last 12 months. We farewelled Craig Johns as our Executive Director for the last 6 year years, and Emily Stacey as our Participation Manager for the last 3 years. I would like to acknowledge both Craig and Emily for their commitment and dedicated contribution to the TACT community.

In January we welcomed Geoff Bartlett as our new Executive Director. Geoff has brought passion, enthusiasm and commitment to his role in continuously improving our triathlon community.

I would like to thank and acknowledge the TACT Board members for their time and commitment.

Our Vice President Angharad Llewellyn, our Treasurer Leeanne Tennent, Steve Hough, our newest life member, Yoann Colin and our recent new members Mary Sietsma and Lara Lever. Also, thanks to previous members Lucas Hayden and Matthew Haustead who both left the Board earlier this year.

We are a small, growing triathlon community that relies on the goodwill of its members and friends, whom often volunteer their time to ensure we are able to conduct our racing schedule across the season.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge our dedicated Technical Official team lead by Gai Webster. Their commitment to provide skilled advice brings a professionalism and friendly atmosphere to our events. A big thank you to Gai for her 20 year commitment and service to the triathlon community.

Financially TACT has successfully weathered the past 12 months, despite COVID and the bush fire smoke. The great support from the ACT Government and our committed members is very much appreciated. TACT would especially like to acknowledge the hard work of Leeanne Tennant and Geoff Bartlett - their ongoing efforts have ensured we are in a strong financial position moving into this season.

Understandably, we experienced a small drop in membership numbers from last year, consistent with the national trend from the expected effects and uncertainty of a COVID world. However, we are forecasting a reversal of this trend with numbers to increase as we emerge from the regime of lockdowns and restrictions.

This year also saw the implementation of a new membership fee structure along with a new registration platform - Go Membership. The new membership structure provides additional membership packages with the introduction of basic and premium.

The long overdue implementation of the new membership/registration platform has delivered enhanced capabilities enabling TA & STTAs to monitor our membership base to better cater for more targeted needs.

More recently TACT has focused on re-engaging with our community to be best placed to provide exciting racing. We have also worked closely with TNSW to initiate a new Club racing series and introduce a 'pathway' program for our emerging young triathletes. This has enabled us to bring on two shared resources, focusing on pathway and communications to help deliver our 2021/22 plans.

This season TACT will especially support our local race director, Canberra Multisport Events to bring an increasing number of race opportunities, as we navigate operating in a COVID world. Support will include promotional assistance and various other assistance where necessary.

Over the past 7 years TA and the STTAs have been exploring a move from the existing Federated sport model to a Future Operating Model - One Management/One Set of Accounts and this has been facilitated by Sport Australia.

In the last 4 months of 2021 TA and the STTAs came together to decide on the future of the proposed Future Operating Model and whether to adopt this model at this time. After careful consideration TACT concluded that further detailed planning by TA was required before TACT would endorse such a major change to our Federated model. Accordingly, TACT advised the TA Board that we would defer our decision for 12 months, and reconsider following further due diligence. TA advised that there will be no change to the current level of services being provided to TACT with this decision.

The session of 2020/21 was successful as we were able to run all events and conduct a magnificent, fun Awards night without being in lockdown.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Triathlon ACT has focused on re-engaging with our community to be best placed to provide exciting racing opportunities. We have also worked closely with Triathlon NSW to initiate a new Club racing series and introduce a pathway program for our emerging young triathletes.

While COVID-19 imposed many restrictions on our events causing some of our local season races to be cancelled along with races cancelled throughout Australia, ACT was able to enjoy local events with 17 events featured on the calendar and had strong attendance at the 2020 Duathlon in October 2020.

Triathlon ACT has also held a three-race Aqua Series across January and February including the ACT Aquathlon Championships. Canberra's highlight event - the Jackie Fairweather Memorial Triathlon Age Group race was able to go ahead in February as a duathlon after being initially postponed, and the ACT's Stromlo Super Sprint showcased some of the best junior, youth and U23 talent from across NSW and the ACT as part of the TNSW/TACT Billigence Pathway Championship Series.

A big thanks goes to Canberra Multisport Events (CME), for creating the Little T's series and other events conducted at Stromlo Forest Park throughout the season.

Triathlon ACT's sanctioning program has grown over the year and now has 20 Officials on the Active Register with four new Local Technical Officials (LTOs) joining the program in 2020/2021. A number of ACT technical officials also travelled interstate to officiate at other sanctioned Triathlon Australia events and World Triathlon events which helped to broaden their technical experience and maintain their accreditation for World Triathlon and TA.

Our dedicated Technical Official team led by Gai Webster, and their commitment to provide skilled advice brought a professionalism and friendly atmosphere to ACT events.

Gai also reached her 20th year of service to the triathlon community - an outstanding achievement.

The 2021 Triathlon ACT Awards celebrated the many achievements of ACT's growing and passionate community, including Tokyo bound para-triathlete Emily Tapp who was awarded Para-Triathlete of the Year.

Canberra up and comer Chloe Bateup continued her great form and took home the Canberra Rising Star award at the 2020 CBR Awards. Canberra junior, Chloe, also made history earlier in the year, becoming the youngest ever female to cross the line in first place at the 2020 Nepean Triathlon.

Financially, Triathlon ACT has successfully weathered the past 12 months, despite the impact of COVID-19 and the bush fire smoke, thanks to the great support from the ACT Government and our loyal ACT members.

TREASURER'S REPORT



I present the Treasurer's Report for Triathlon ACT Inc. (the Association) for the year ending 30 June 2021. The financial statements, as presented, have been audited. The result for the year was a surplus of \$34,078, compared to \$45,338 last year. Considering the challenges faced with COVID-19 restrictions this is an outstanding result.

The 2020/2021 year was a very difficult year due to COVID-19 and the lake being closed due to algae blooms. There was good attendance at the 2020 Duathlon in October 2020. TACT held 3 Aquathlons in January and February including the ACT Aquathlon Championships. The JFMT was held in February as a Duathlon.

Total income for 2020/2021 was \$232, 291 down from \$270, 088 the previous year.

The profit for the year was due to the ACT Govt Sport Sector Support Package, the Federal Government Job Keeper payments and the ATO Cash Flow Boost. These payments totalled \$61,895 making up 26.7% of the income.

Total expenditure was \$198,213 – a decrease from \$224,750 in 2019/2020.

Office expenses were lower because we received a rental discount from the ACT Govt. Event expenses were down due to the cancelation of events and staffing expenses were down as we didn't have the same level of staffing. Craig Johns resigned as ED and left TACT on 27/09/20 and Emily Stacey left TACT on 24/12/2020.

TACT has budgeted a loss for 2021/22 of (\$48,140). The Finance Committee will monitor the budget throughout the year considering the impact of event cancellations as they occur.

Revenue received from TA for membership rebate and cost recovery has increased to \$4,269.67 this financial year. There are a number of events on the calendar for 2021/22 hosted by Canberra Multisport Events and Elite Energy. TACT will hold the Aquathlon series and the ACT Aquathlon Championships.

Net Assets for the year are \$200,148 up from \$165,669 last year. No deposits were made into the Beyond Bank reserves this financial year.

The current system of an external bookkeeper contracted to review the payroll and submit the quarterly GST and tax obligations, is working efficiently.

Elucidate Accounting has performed the 2020-21 audit, and the Board has not signed off on the financials as we still have questions for the Auditor. These will be resolved next week for the audited financials to be included in the Annual Return. The Board recommends using a different Auditor next year due to the difficulty of receiving the audited financial statements this year.

Being the first year on the Board as Treasurer and the new Executive Director not starting until January, I have found the role challenging. Geoff Bartlett took up his role as Executive Director in January and was immediately thrown into the organisation of the JFMT and the Aquathlons.

I would like to thank TACT president Sally Hamilton and the Board for their contribution and support.

TECHNICAL REPORT

The period 1st July 2020 to 30th June 2021 was a trying season for the ACT Technical Team with the never ending COVID-19 situation. Covid put many restrictions on our events as well as cancelling some of our local season's races with more races cancelled throughout Australia. We now have 20 Officials on the Active Register as at 30/6/21 – 4 up from last season.

The statistics look like this:

We have 4 new LTOs (Aaron Coventry, David Leake, Lara Lever, Gaby Wade) who have graduated from the LTO On-Line program that TA had developed. Aaron, Lara and Gaby have completed their Field of Play (FOP) event. David will complete his FOP at his first event in 2021-22 season.

In the beginning, 100 local TOs positions were available this season for 20 events but due to Covid-19 restrictions, 3 major events were cancelled – Weetbix, Canberra Tri Festival, JFMT Youth/Juniors 1 day event. The Splash'n'Dash series was also cancelled due to lack of a Race Director and race staff. The JFMT Age Group draft legal 1 day event was postponed until 21st February 2021.

- 7 local TOs positions were allocated and present at 2 Duathlon events.
- 49 TOs positions were allocated and present at 11 summer events.

A number of ACT TOs also went interstate to officiate at other sanctioned TA events and World Triathlon events which helped to broaden their technical experience and maintain their accreditation for World Triathlon and TA.

Training:

World Triathlon NTO (Level 1) course was scheduled with 1 attendee, Iain Addinell, but cancelled due to Covid-19.

Future Courses:

The TA LTO (Level 1) On-line course is available at all times via the TA website but currently no-one is scheduled to complete their Modules.

The TA RTO (Level 2) course is face-to-face currently. This is being developed into an on-line course which should be available next calendar year.

Future Events:

Based on the information received to date, we have 2 Duathlons early in the 2021-22 season which are the Sri Chinmoy Off Road Duathlon on 1 August 2021 and the ACT Duathlon Championships on 31 October 2021. The advertised ACT summer calendar has 19 events comprising small to medium (less than 1000 athletes) events for the coming summer season. Weetbix Kids is not scheduled for 2021-22 – we now do not have a large event (greater than 1000 athletes).

Covid-19

The ACT went into Lockdown at 5pm 12 August 2021 and this will lift at 11:59pm 28 October 2021. This Lockdown resulted in some events being cancelled or re-scheduled to later dates.

From 29 October 2021 events will be capped to 150 athletes and spectators (excluding staff) until late November 2021. This may change at a later date. Because of the 150 athlete/spectator limitation, Elite Energy have already moved their 27 November 2021 event to 22 January 2022.

Accreditation Equation

To maintain their annual accreditation for 2021-22 each ACT Official needs a minimum of 3 TA sanctioned events each season. For 20 TOs we require a minimum of 60 Technical FOP positions. Also, the ATO (Level 3) Officials require a least 1 Senior Technical Team (STT) position of Race Referee or Technical Delegate at the WQE level and the RTO (Level 2) Officials require at least one STT local position.

The ACT 2021-22 Calendar currently shows 21 winter and summer events which equates to 93 Technical FOP positions. But since we already have re-scheduling of events and the cap of 150 athletes/ spectators from 29 October for the ACT Officials at ACT events we may need to supplement these FOP positions with interstate Technical Officials when they are allowed to travel to the ACT.





Scope
