

CHILD PROTECTION RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN

ORGANISATIONAL ROLES AND RESPONSIBLITIES.

Child Safety Representative

- Reviews the Club's child protection policy and procedures (website, risk management plan etc) annually
- Ensures that the Club's child protection policy and complaint processes are available to all members
- Ensures that his/her contact details are readily available to all members
- Is responsible for the Club's WWC records and ensures that they are current
- Facilitates the complaints process

Kids' Race Director

- Performs a child protection risk assessment of the event site prior to every club event
- Ensures that the Transition Director has a current WWC check

CHILD SAFE RISK ASSESSMENT

NSW Triathlon has developed this template to assist club volunteers and committees conduct an internal 'Child Safe Risk Assessment' on your club activities.

Risk in a situation can be assessed as a matrix which identifies the 'Probability' (i.e. how likely is the situation to occur' vs the 'consequences' (i.e. what is the impact on the club and child if the situation occurs').

The Following definitions can be used as a guideline to determine the level 'Likelihood'.

1. Remote	Would only occur in highly exceptional circumstances. An extremely remote chance of occurrence.
2. Unlikely	Not likely to occur. A small, but remote chance of occurrence due to the circumstances or situations that could arise.
3. Possible	Likely to occur at least once, but not expected to occur much more than this.
4. Likely	Likely to occur more than once, but not an everyday occurrence. Preconditions will arise at times.
5. Almost Certain	Will occur. Circumstances are likely to arise often throughout the period that will provide opportunity for the event to occur.

The following definitions can be used as a guideline to determine the level of consequences:

1. Insignificant	No injuries or fatalities, little community disruption and no environmental or other damage.
2. Minor	Small number of injuries, no fatalities, only first-aid required and some environmental or other damage (but not lasting).
3. Moderate	Hospital treatment required, no fatalities, some community inconvenience, some environmental damage (small, long-term affect) and other damage.
4. Major	Extensive injuries, significant hospitalisation, some services unavailable, extensive environmental damage (long term affect), other extensive damage and some community displacement.
5. Severe	Fatalities, injuries and extended hospitalisation periods, widespread community displacement, extensive and widespread damage and significant short or long-term environmental damage.





The Risk Matrix allows clubs to decide how high a risk is, and the implications if the situation occurs.
