About Triathlon Queensland

Triathlon Queensland is the state governing body responsible for the strategic development of the sport of triathlon within Queensland. It has 74 affiliated triathlon clubs who are regarded as voting members, as well as administers approximately 4,600 individual AusTriathlon members and 46,000 event participants in Queensland.

As an affiliated State and Territory Triathlon Association with AusTriathlon (a recognised World Triathlon and Australian Sports Commission National Federation), Triathlon Queensland seeks to foster the growth and development of triathlon in Queensland, as well as continuously grow, strengthen and connect the triathlon family and every starting line in Queensland.

The Role of the Board

The Triathlon Queensland Board under Clause 25 of the Triathlon Queensland Constitution is comprised of up to six elected and two appointed directors who collectively have the skills, knowledge, experience and attributes to effectively govern the organisation.

It is desirable, but not required for Directors to have an understanding of the Queensland/Australia sport environment and the role and contribution of a State Sporting Organisation and / or an understanding of member-based organisations and the expectations of members, participants, volunteers and clubs.

The Board seeks to be comprised of board members who are diverse in respect of:

- gender;
- age;
- culture; and
- background.

Skillset of the Board

It is expected that Directors will have relevant qualifications and experience in disciplines that are required by the organisation, the makeup of this can evolve depending on the needs of the organisation.

Positions on the Board

At the 2025 Annual General Meeting, three (3) interested directors (Cara Turnley, Sue Fairweather and Drew Standish) will vacate the positions they hold.

Three (3) interested directors (Joe Hurley, Rosie McGeoch and Darren Ryan) will remain on the board until the 2026 Annual General Meeting.

At the 2025 Annual General Meeting, the members must elect three (3) interested directors to serve for 2 years ending at the 2027 Annual General Meeting.
